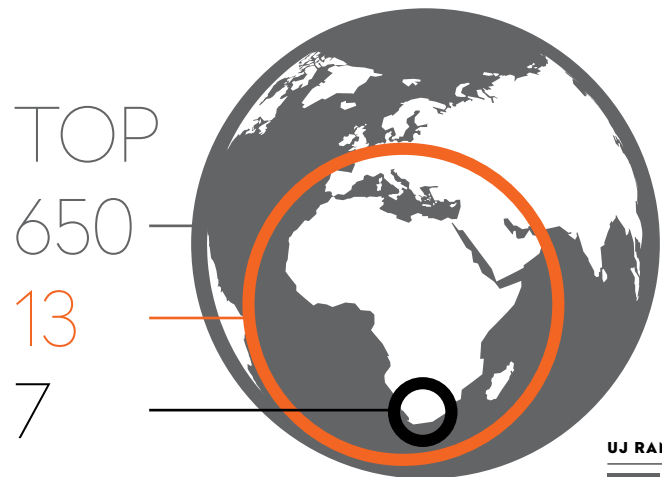
In less than a decade of being in existence UJ was welcomed as the first and only African member institution of the prestigious Universitas 21, and ranked highly among reputable universities around the world.

QUACQUARELLI SYMONDS (QS) WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS

The university's latest Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings for 2013/2014 placed UJ in the top 4% of global universities and the only comprehensive South African University to reach the top 650 ranked institutions.

UNIVERSITY RANKING BY ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE (URAP)

UJ climbed 250 places globally and was ranked 6th in South Africa by the esteemed University Ranking by Academic Performance (URAP) ranking system for 2013. URAP ranking system ranks the top 2000 Higher Education Institutions globally on academic performance and excellence. UJ has progressively climbed the URAP ranking since 2010 when it was ranked 1183 in comparison to its current global ranking of 788. The University is positioned 9th in Africa and has moved two spaces in 2013 to the firm standing of 6th in South Africa.

QUACQUARELLI SYMONDS (QS) UNIVERSITY RANKINGS: BRICS FOR 2013

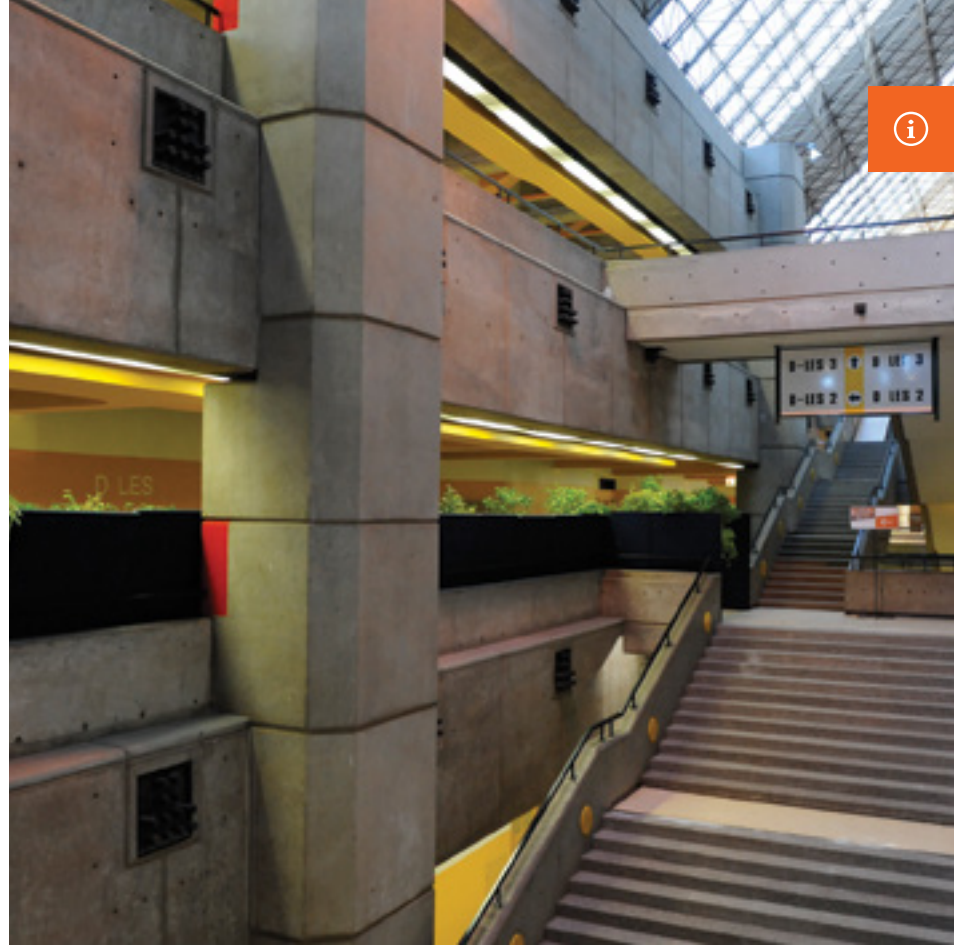

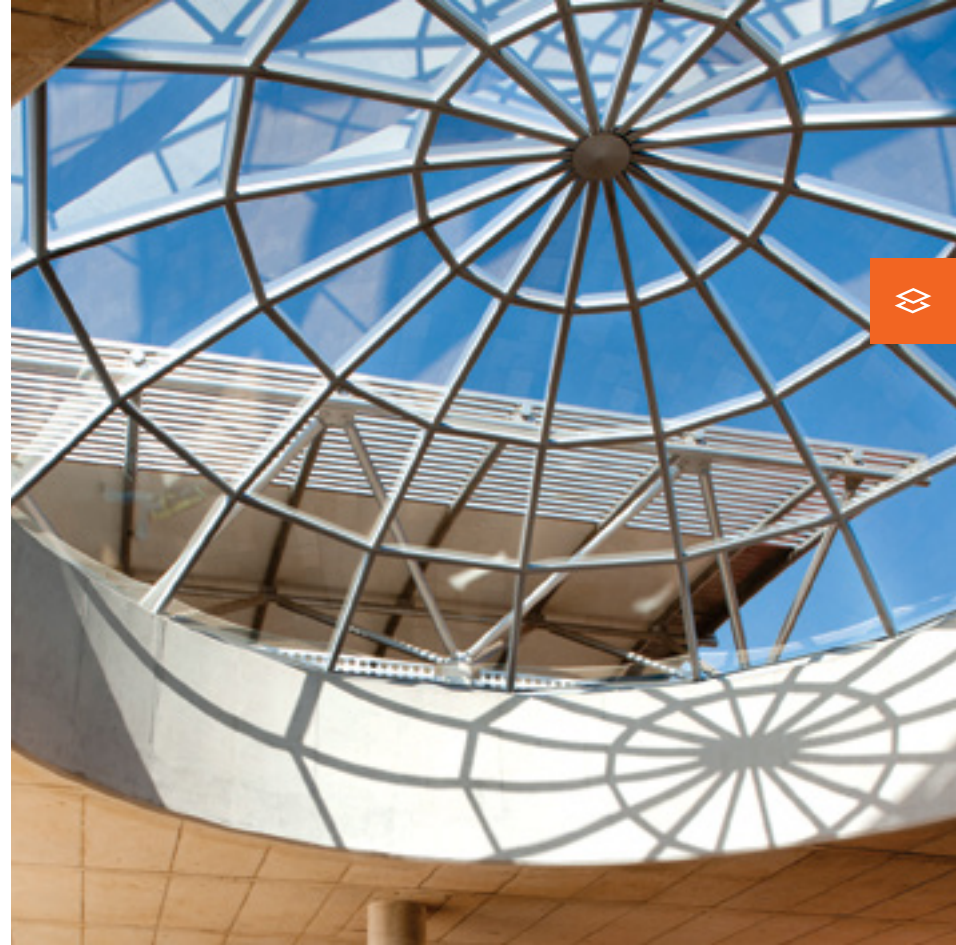
The University encourages a culture of service as part of the University student experience and it proudly pursues a four language policy in English, isiZulu, Afrikaans and Sesotho sa Leboa.

RESEARCH EXCELLENCE

UJ ranks among the top six residential universities in South Africa in terms of accredited research output. The University's accredited research output is up with a staggering 137%, since 2005. UJ is up 121% on its 2007 output, by far exceeding its 2011 targets. In the process UJ has grown its national research output share from 4.5% (2007) to 7.1% in 2012.

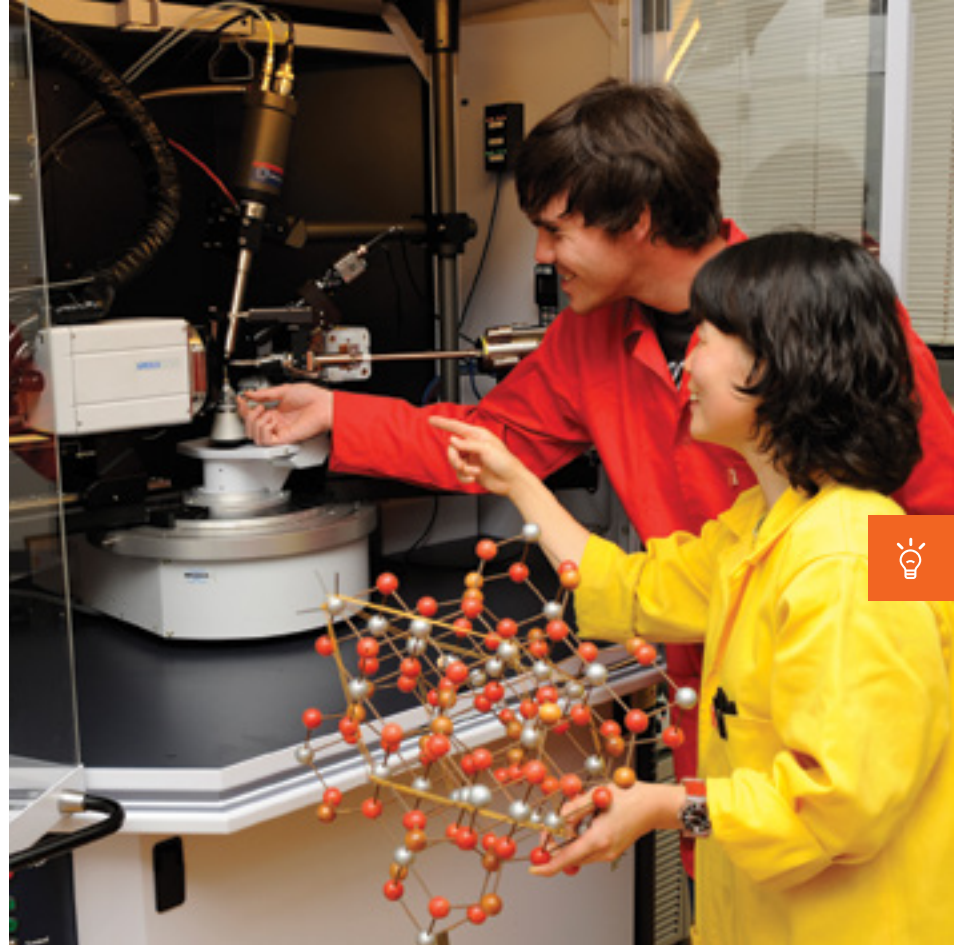

RATED RESEARCHERS

UJ currently has 133 rated researchers, rated by means of a peer-reviewed system managed by the NRF, six of whom have been awarded the prestigious NRF A-rating. The NRF defines A-rated researchers as:

The University of Johannesburg is also a leader in technology transfer and innovation, with 6 new patents and 4 new commercial initiatives having been registered and approved in 2012. The commercial initiatives are: Photovoltaic Technology Intellectual Property, Silver Anticancer Compounds, Mineral Positron Emission Tomography (PET) and Down Draft Stove.

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE (FYE)

An encompassing support programme to assist all first year students with the transition from school to university. FYE includes First Year Seminars, which orients students over the first two weeks; Extended Orientation throughout the first semester; SAFENET, an early warning system for students at risk; and encompassing tutorial programme; and a programme of academic excellence in the residences and day-houses. FYE runs on all campuses and in all Faculties. The past few years have seen substantial improvement in first year success rates, which have now reached 81%.

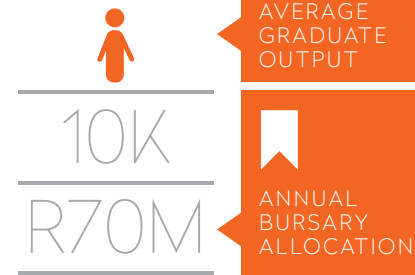
BURSARIES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The University makes a sizeable contribution to the skilled population of the country with an average output of 10 000 graduates annually.

A total of R70M is allocated to bursaries annually in order to assist our students accomplish their academic objectives, so the University also relies on third stream income to sustain its financial reserves.

Higher education in South Africa is funded by a combination of state subsidies (first-stream income), student fees (second-stream income) and funding from other sources (third-stream income). In common with higher education around the world, the sector's reliance on state subsidies has declined. As

fee income has not kept up with inflation, universities have turned increasingly to third-stream income to fund their operations. Third-stream income includes funds obtained from contract or sponsored research, entrepreneurial or commercialisation activities, philanthropic funding, provision of services, investments and borrowing.
